The Kaiyo Mission is the first indie game of its genre localised in the Basaa language which is widely spoken in Western Africa.

The different vision modes, sound effects and music make the experience varied and engaging. Some of the context is realistic to a certain extent, based on real research, science and hard science-fiction. The player is placed in an international context, where humanity works together to push the boundaries of our knowledge and understanding.





The Kaiyo Mission uses African music in its science-fiction game: Not many people associate space travel and the exploration of our universe with anything related to Africa. This is often so, because many of us are biased to rather associate these topics with classical music, or sometimes western music, or bespoke 'futuristic' music. The Kaiyō Mission wants to break this sub-conscious bias.


